

The Code



The International Code of Conduct for Private Security Service Providers ('the Code')'s key standards and principles for the responsible provision of private security services includes two broad categories:

- 1) Principles regarding the conduct of private security personnel based on **international human rights and humanitarian law standards** including rules on the use of force, sexual violence, human trafficking and child labour;
- 2) Principles regarding the management and governance of private security companies including the selection, vetting and proper training of personnel.

The Association



The Code's governing body – the International Code of Conduct Association ('ICoCA') - is a multi-stakeholder initiative based on three pillars representing private security companies, civil society organisations and governments. The Association promotes, governs and oversees the implementation of the Code through certification, monitoring and the processing of complaints.

- Exchange information and lessons learnt on private security governance and oversight
- Joint capacity-building of CSOs, private security companies and governments on international private security standards
- Mutual support on monitoring of private security providers
- Reinforce eachother's support to victims of human rights violations and/or of other violations by private security companies.
- Raise awareness on private security governance and oversight opportunities, issues and challenges
- Create mutual space for constructive engagement with key stakeholders (governments, CSOs, private security companies, clients and experts) on private security governance and oversight
